

On FNRC web site burials there are forty three KIMBERs. KIMBER is a well-known Newbury family. There are Alms Houses named after them, Elsie KIMBER was the first Lady Mayor of Newbury and some had a grocer's shop at the junction of Pound Street and Bartholomew Street still known as KIMBER'S Corner.

A family name was WILLIAM WALTER (WALLER) and there are three of these; two and their wives are in this grave and appear on this headstone.

In Burials on the FNRC web site there are four KIMBERs buried in August. One, a 5 month old baby, who doesn't appear to have a grave. Maybe he is in this one.

On the page of burial records besides WILLIAM WALTER KIMBER (5 months) there are two other children aged 8 months and 3 years. Was there an epidemic that year in August or was this normal?
